

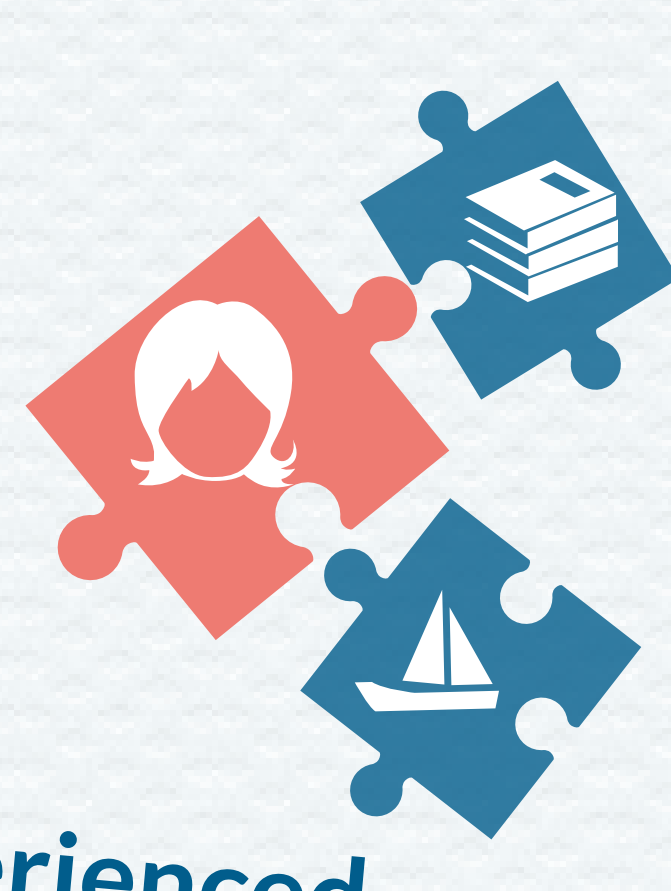
THE HIDDEN CURRICULUM

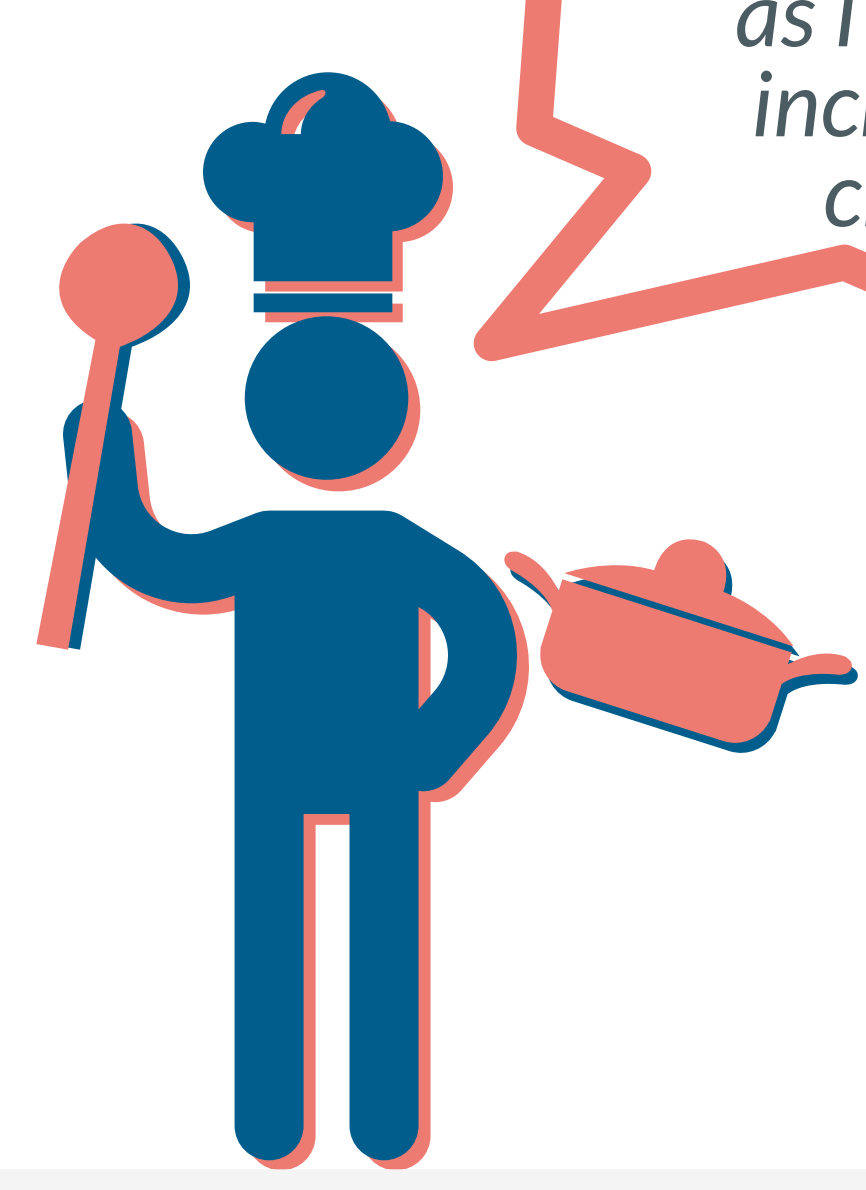
The activities you do

What you take pleasure in and find time to learn and enjoy.

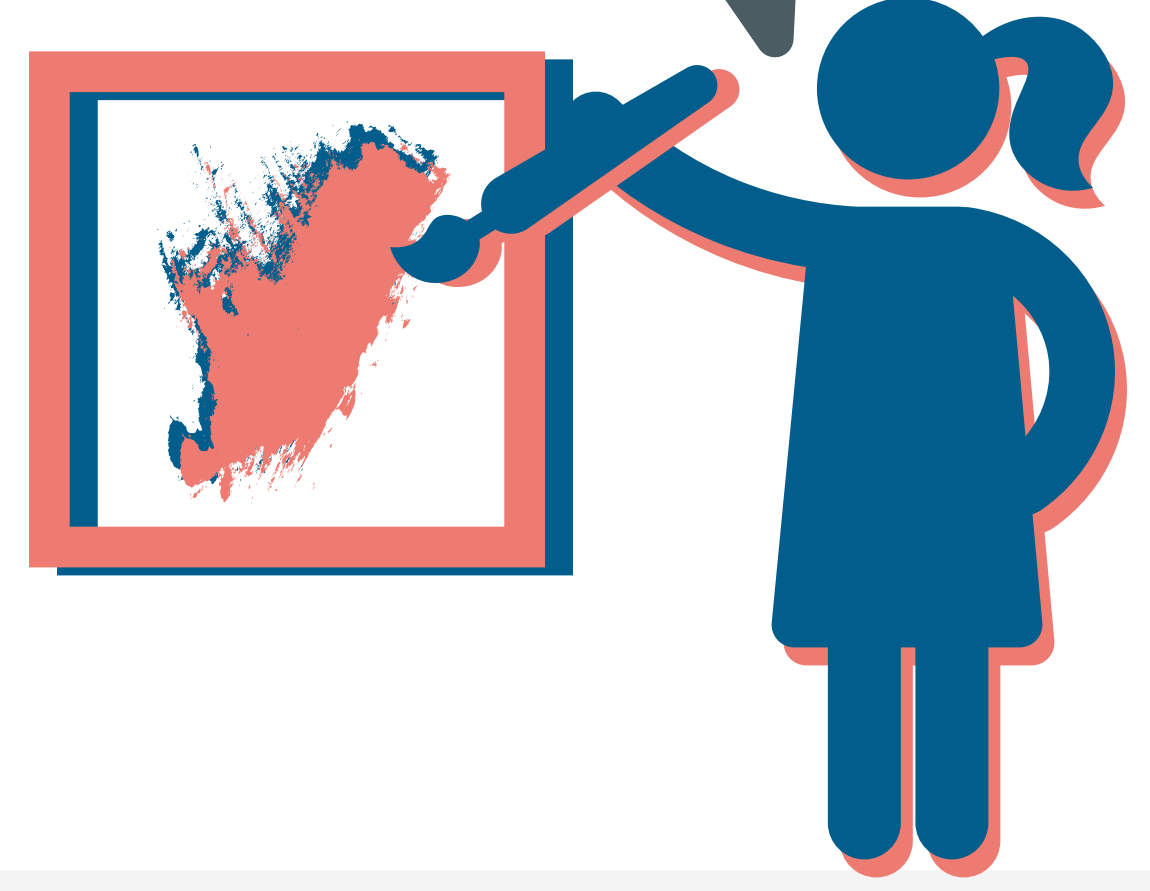
I collect mechanical calculator machines. I know how to search for them and, when I get them, I restore them myself



I am always reading about healthy nutrition. In particular the innovations coming from the United States



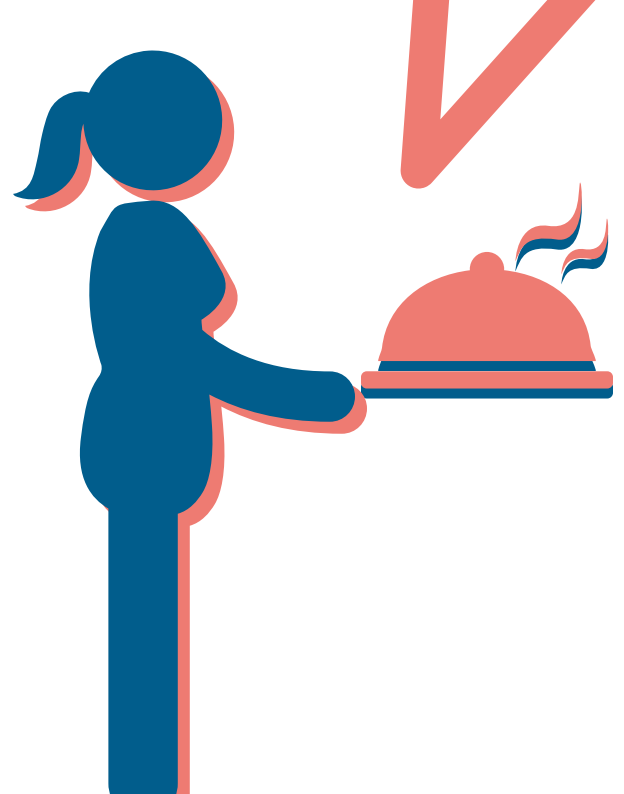
Whenever I can, I go to work camps making use of my holidays. Above all, those to restore historical heritage
